Thanks to your constant support we have managed to keep everyone healthy and well.


We have even rehomed a few.

THE FIREWORK SEASON IS UPON US

From now until January 2024 fireworks will be a feature of our lives as this period encompasses not only Guy Fawkes night but celebrations from other creeds and religions.

It is a stressful time and many children, domestic and wild animals will be injured and that is why CLAWS supports the campaign to restrict their use to organised displays.

We advise you to : -

- Bring your pets in before it gets dark. Lock the doors and windows pull the curtains and switch on the radio or television to help deaden the noise of the fireworks.
- Keep calm. Animals pick up on your emotions and your anxiety will transmit itself to them.
- Try to acclimatise your pets to firework noises. Download sounds of fireworks and play them at low levels to your pet, slowly increasing volume over time
- Search log piles and bonfires to make sure no hedgehogs and other creatures are sheltering in their depths

Please help to protect these innocent creatures which rely on us for their every need.



So apparently Sheba is fine with cats, as long as they look just like her.




